



CITY MANAGER'S OFFICE

Earlier this summer, the City of Monrovia was named a **2024 All-America City winner!** Every year, the National Civic League recognizes 10 cities across the United States that have created unique programs that meet this year's theme, "Strengthening Democracy through Local Action and Innovation."

While there are so many incredible programs and services across our organization and community, this year, the City of Monrovia focused on three programs that met the goals of what it meant to strengthen our democracy through local action. They are:

MAP - MAP was created to help address criminal activity and restore the blighted conditions in neighborhoods. In trying to understand how to address these issues, the City's strategy team quickly learned that residents did not trust local government, were unsure if conditions could truly change, and did not want to be involved in local government. The MAP team was created to build a bridge between citizens and the government. The first block party was held, and well over 500 residents attended! The MAP team reduced Code Enforcement cases. reduced crime activity, and secured grants to continue the efforts communitywide. With the success of the MAP program, they developed the MAP Leadership Academy, which offered a seven-week course covering topics such as public speaking and governmental

positions in hopes of graduates entering government and local leadership roles. MAP also expanded its academy to the youth of Monrovia, and to this date, over 200 people have graduated from the academy. KGEM—Since 1996, the City of Monrovia has operated a public access channel to provide residents with direct news, updates, and information about the City. Our current partnership with Community Media of the Foothills provides more than public education and government access; it creates a space for community-led civic engagement. Initially focused on covering city council, planning commission meetings, and city events, KGEM's partnership with CMF broadened content to include community-driven programming. This includes interviews with local election candidates, election coverage, and public service announcements. Additionally, community activists and citizen journalists committed to engaging marginalized groups have access to CMF's studio for filming and broadcasting. In 2023 alone, CMF produced 187 videos, broadcast 85 municipal meetings, and provided 62 pieces of field equipment to volunteer producers. They recently launched an internship program to educate youth about civic engagement and media.

Monrovia Unified School District Partnership The third-grade field trips began in 2023 after students at Bradoaks Elementary School returned from Christmas break to discover that the rose bushes on their campus had been removed without consultation.

been removed without consultation. Concerned, they wrote a letter to the principal seeking an explanation. As part of the project, students visited city hall and the community center, meeting with the city manager, city councilmember, and various city departments. Each department explained its services and engaged students in interactive activities. Since then, the City has hosted over 900 students and continued the voting theme by creating mock elections for students, ballots, and polls! We aim to teach students the importance of democracy, familiarize them with voting, and ensure their voices are heard! We know the future is promising when we see our youth understand these concepts and apply them to their school.

For many years, the City of Monrovia has found a way to empower residents, engage its community, and educate our youth for a promising tomorrow. Receiving an All-America City award demonstrates that in Monrovia, we are better together!

Community Activist Policing Tip

A NEW SCHOOL YEAR MEANS NEW BEGINNINGS...AND NEW CHALLENGES.

As we approach the new school year, the Community Activist Policing Officers want Monrovia Parents to know that our top priority is to ensure your children's safety and well-being. That is why we are providing the following three back-to-school safety tips, for parents to remember.

First, keep an open line of communication with your child. Encourage them to share concerns about safety, interactions with their peers, or any abnormal incidents. Being aware will help you address issues immediately and offer guidance.

Second, educate your child about internet safety. Teach them to protect their personal information, avoid sharing sensitive data and photographs, and to recognize potential online threats. Installing parental control software isn't a bad idea.

Lastly, discuss bullying with your child and emphasize the importance of treating others with kindness and respect. Encourage them to report bullying to School Officials, whether they are a victim or a witness of it.

Code Enforcement Tip

Private Property Vehicle Regulations

In Monrovia, many residents own vehicles, including campers and boats. These vehicles enhance our daily transportation and leisure activities, but to maintain safety and the town's aesthetic appeal, specific rules and codes must be followed.

For vehicles parked on private property, property owners must adhere to specific rules to ensure proper parking. This includes guidelines for inoperable vehicles, parking on lawns or unpaved surfaces, and recreational vehicle parking requirements.

Guidelines for Parking on Private Property

Inoperable Vehicles: Vehicles that are abandoned, inoperable, dismantled, or wrecked cannot be parked or stored outdoors in public view. Such vehicles pose safety hazards and are considered unsightly. They must be either repaired or stored inside a garage or in a rear driveway area out of public view.



Parking on Lawns: Parking a vehicle on the lawn or unpaved surface is prohibited. This practice is unsightly and can diminish property value.

Code Enforcement Tip

Recreational Vehicles: Recreational vehicle, camper shell, trailer, boat or similar vehicle shall be parked in an entirely closed building. If stored outside, they, must be kept in the rear or side yard, screened from view from the street, alley and adjacent properties, and the storage surface must be paved. Recreational vehicles are allowed to be stored on the street with a permit issued by the Monrovia Police Department.

YELLOW TAGS

In an effort to reduce illegal dumping and encourage proper disposal of bulky items, the City of Monrovia launched the #CleanMonrovia campaign. This is a multidepartment strategy to provide educational resources to residents and to curb illegal dumping.

Code Enforcement Officers will be placing a yellow tag on dumped items and at the front door of the property if they are unable to make contact with the resident. These "yellow tags" have a step-by-step process to schedule a bulky item pickup with Athens Services so it does not become illegal dumping.

If you receive a yellow tag and did NOT schedule with Athens, please remove the item from public view and schedule a pickup with Athens. It will typically be the same day as your trash service. If you DID schedule a pickup you can disregard the yellow tag.

LOG YOUR HOURS

Track it Forward is the program we use to track volunteer efforts. Volunteers can log hours via the web or mobile app, as well as sign up for events and track their progress for requirements.

Step 1: Go to

www.monroviaareapartnership.com/leg= hours and scroll down until you see the Track It Forward widget.

Step 2: Create an account by clicking on 'Click Here to Register'. Fill out the information.

Step 3: Log your hours by filling in the number of hours volunteered, date volunteered, activity, and bonus points (if any), and click 'Submit Time'.

GOALS

- Increase participation of MAP Leaders at events, social media, and in their neighborhoods.
- Provide toolkits to encourage networking amongst neighbors in the different zones.
- Honor those MAP Leaders who climb the tiers and dedicate their time to the community.
- Encourage MAP Leaders to recruit their neighbors and get involved.

COMMUNITY SERVICE HOURS

- In addition to earning points to climb the tiers, MAP Leaders will earn hours for the time they spend volunteering at activities.
- MAP will then award the Leader with the United States Presidential Volunteer Service Award (National Award)
- Bronze (100 hrs), Silver (250 hrs), and Gold (500+ hours)
- Receive a pin, certificate, and letter from the President of the United States.

HONORING LEADERS

Once a year, MAP will make a presentation to City Council honoring all the MAP Leaders who moved up a tier or were awarded a Presidential Volunteer Service Award.
